The Vicar Writes

Change is afoot in the Church of England! Several Dioceses have been under real financial pressure in recent years and many have been running unsustainable deficits for some time. Whenever someone is talking (or writing) about Diocesan finances, it's always good to make the distinction between the Dioceses and the central funds of the Church of England. Central funds and investments have been doing well since George Carey set about rescuing its finances in the 1980s. Central funds administer the Church nationally and pay for its Bishops. The Dioceses are a separate and different matter. Dioceses rely on contributions from Parishes, investments and whatever historic income/assets they may possess.

Here in Lincoln, the Diocese is considered to be 'land rich' as it owns a considerable amount of agricultural land. However, the income from such assets is limited and the answer to each new problem or challenge cannot be to 'sell another farm' as the family silver won't last forever.

Right now, the sums don't add up for the Diocese. Which means clergy posts will have to be cut from 140 to less than 100. This isn't as drastic as you might think. Over in Nottinghamshire the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham cut clergy back to the magic '100 posts' in 2006. The real change comes with the planned reorganisation of Parish ministry both here and in other Diocese.

Whereas previously the Church of England could boast of having a presence in every community, clergy will now be expected to operate in teams across ever-larger geographical areas. They will offer services in fewer Churches with the expectation that larger, successful congregations may have worship every week, whereas, small villages may only have worship up to six times a year (e.g. Christmas, Easter,

Harvest, Remembrance, Patronal Festival, and Mothering Sunday).

The other clarion call of the new thinking is that the Church must offer variety! A diverse menu of different services in different places is now called for. The notion that two neighbouring Churches can be found doing the same or similar is considered to be a misallocation of resources. Logic would have us think that, if people want something, they'll travel to get it (a bit like supermarket shopping). Sadly, that isn't how it works. In many Parishes, 'joint service' is synonymous with 'Sunday off'!

On one level this might all seem perfectly sensible (and much of it is). Many will tell you that it is not the beginning of the end of the Parish system but others will swear blind that it is. My greatest concern lies in the contrast between 'somewhere' and 'anywhere'.

The Parish system is all about being 'somewhere' and sees rootedness in a particular place as paramount. What is currently being proposed is the change from 'somewhere' to 'anywhere'; prioritising gatherings in a few select Church buildings unconnected to any locality to experience worship based on 'themes' rather than 'context' or 'community'.

Outside of metropolitan areas, the Parish system brings the Church into contact with local communities. It is the way in which, for centuries, the Church has sought to live out the commandment to take the Good News of Jesus Christ out to all nations (to somewhere).

The new thinking suggests that, if you want us, you'll probably have to look us up and find us. Whereas previously your local Church notice board would tell you 'when' services were due to happen, it could soon be the case that it will tell you 'where' a service is happening (because it's unlikely to be happening in your Church anytime soon). It will also mean that you won't so much have a Parish Priest, instead, you'll just have

Rogation Walk on Sunday 9th May 2021

On this sunny, slightly blustery day, 11 people, 2 priests and a dog met at Swinstead Church for the annual walk to re-enact the beating of the bounds to pray for our crops during this new season. The word rogation comes from the word 'rogare', to ask and Rogation Day is especially devoted to asking God's blessing on agriculture and industry.

And so we began, outside the church, with a rousing rendition of 'For the beauty of the earth' before processing to Station 1: An Orchard for a reading and prayers surrounded by apple blossom and then on to Station 2: Woodland in the woods at the edge of Grimsthorpe Park. We emerged back out into the sunshine to be faced with the magnificent view of Grimsthorpe Castle across the valley and the lake glistening below.

We made a straggling group, chatting along the way, catching up with our news, glad to be sociable after months of lockdown. Station 3: Water and Father Ed, the only one in wellies, braved the ford while the rest crossed the bridge over the lake outfall and we made our way up the hill. Station 4: Crops and Fields was made surrounded by fields of winter wheat where we disturbed a small herd of roe deer. By now, we could see the flag waving on top of St. Michael and All Angels Church, encouraging us back to the Regional House for tea.

As we passed through Copy Lawn Farm, we paused for Station 5: Livestock surrounded by sheep and lambs, some young pigs and fine Limousin cattle. A quick burst up the main road, competing with the Sunday afternoon motorcyclists and we all made it to the final stop outside the Regional House for Station 6: A Place of Hospitality and sure enough, tea, coffee, quiche and cakes!

The speaker at the May meeting, held by Zoom, was Patty Harris who spoke about the Spalding Gentlemen's Society, which began in 1710 being one of the oldest societies in England. It was started by Maurice Johnson, a drainage lawyer who lived in Ayscoughfee Hall and enjoyed the coffee houses in London, so decided to start something similar in Spalding. Meetings were held every Thursday – the day the periodicals were delivered.

Members gathered to read the periodicals and drink coffee. The joining fee was donating a book and subscription. Famous members included Tennyson and Isaac Newton.

The Society has over 10,000 books and documents, including maps of the original drainage systems for the fens – still referred to by consultants today.

The museum is a treasure trove in the process of being catalogued. Some are fragile and are being conserved. A strong room holds rare items which can be viewed when visiting. In

normal times there are meetings every Thursday and a programme of lectures.

Jane Wilmot gave the vote of thanks for a fascinating talk and assured the speaker that the WI will visit the museum as soon as possible!

Witham Hall School Runs to Raise Money for "Don't Lose Hope"

At the end of April, pupils and staff took part in the annual Witham Hall Fun Run. This year's event was held in support of Don't Lose Hope, the Bournebased mental health charity. Eddy Bear, Don't Lose Hope's mascot, was there, along with Mr and Mrs Austen, to start the race, cheering pupils to the finish line. Each child was asked to seek sponsorship for the event from family and friends, efforts which have raised more than £6,000 for the local charity. Everyone embraced the spirit of the event, running in fancy dress and house colours.

Don't Lose Hope and Eddy Bear are not new to the Witham Hall community. Eddy Bear arrived to huge smiles and excitement in March for his surprise appearance at an outdoor assembly when children returned to school following the most recent lockdown. Dom and Nicola Brister from Don't Lose Hope explained how the Fun Run would support Don't Lose Hope's professional counselling service for all members of the community from age four upwards, regardless of their financial means. Witham Hall Pre-Prep also keep Don't Lose Hope 'Worry Monsters' in every classroom, encouraging the younger children to share their concerns and worries. The concept is that they jot down their 'worry' or whisper it in the Worry Monster's ear, and the worry monster 'eats' it. Each worry monster has a name and is a reminder to speak up when you need help or are worried.

Headmaster, William Austen, commented, 'We are working to normalise conversations about mental health with the children, wearing away any stigma. Of course, there is value in the children learning to play a part in the community through events like the Fun Run, but Eddy Bear's participation has also been hugely helpful in our efforts to teach the children that we have to consider our mental and emotional wellbeing in the same way we look after our physical health.'

Nicola Brister, founder and CEO of the charity, added, 'We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone at Witham Hall, not only for the incredible amount of money raised, but for a really fun afternoon. All the funds raised will be going towards providing play therapy and counselling for children and young people.'

Witham Hall is a happy and thriving boarding and day school for boys and girls aged 4 to 13 years. We are committed to an education both in and beyond the classroom, thereby enabling the academic, artistic and physical potential of each child to flourish. Coupled with their purpose and determination to succeed, this broad programme enables our children to acquire a strong sense of achievement, a quiet confidence and an awareness of both themselves and each other.

LOCAL WALKS

Edenham – Scottlethorpe – Auster Lodge – Edenham

Distance: 6 miles/10 km Going: Easy going – muddy in places when wet Start: Edenham Village Hall car park

- Turn left out of the car park and walk past the Vicarage entrance following the road around to the main road (A151). Turn left onto the A151, cross over the road and take the first right towards Scottlethorpe.
- Keep on the road through Scottlethorpe onto a well-maintained concrete road past a gate/barrier and a house. Downhill over the small bridge, climbing back up towards a wood.
- 3. Turn left at the footpath sign just before you enter the wood towards Scottlethorpe Grange.
- 4. At Scottlethorpe Grange, go to the left of the hedge and over a stile following the footpath straight ahead then bending to the left and diagonally across a field. If it is very muddy, you could keep to the right of the field and follow the field-line anti-clockwise to the bottom point of the field.
- Turn right following the footpath signs towards the ford then left to a small wooden bridge. Cross the bridge and turn right keeping close to the Rough Hills Plantation fence line.
- 6. Turn slightly left at the end of the plantation and head for the bridge crossing the river once more. (Be careful not to head for the other crossing slightly to the right which is, initially, easier to see). Climb the hill following the footpath towards Auster Lodge.

- 7. As you enter Auster Lodge go past the first shed turning slightly right then left again between the buildings onto the road. Follow the "Toft" road to the A151 then back to Edenham and the car park.
- Should you not wish to take the grass verge along the A151, you can take the signed footpath just before the junction back towards Scottlethorpe, turning right at the road and retracing your steps to the car park.



Woodcroft Castle

Woodcroft Castle is a mainly late 13th century structure with a few early Tudor period additions, tucked away in the back roads just north of Peterborough. It was the site of the only substantial military action of the English Civil War in Peterborough, when in 1648 it was besieged by Parliamentary forces determined to capture Michael Hudson, its commander. Dr. Hudson was a priest, chaplain to Charles I, and, despite his calling, a dyed-in-the-wool Royalist who launched armed raids into the surrounding area. The siege was a bloody affair which led to deaths on both sides, including Dr. Hudson, but victory for the Roundheads.

I only found out about the castle in the summer of 2019 in an estate agent's advert in an old newspaper. I did a bit of research and it seemed a fascinating place. So even though privately owned, I was keen to visit.

The castle is not easy to get to. I tried the narrow lane south of Etton from the Glinton to Helpston road but was thwarted when I reached the level crossing of the East Coast Main railway line. The lady crossing keeper warned me that as it was only an insignificant crossing, controlled from Helpston, it could be a half hour wait until the gate was opened.

I had better luck with my next attempt. I drove south along King Street and left to Marholm. In the village I turned left along the narrow lane back to Etton. After 2 miles I reached Woodcroft Castle and parked on a muddy farm track opposite.

The castle is circled by a moat and well set back from the road in extensive grounds with large trees. I walked up the entrance drive, hoping to meet someone who would give me permission to take photographs. A gang of builders was renovating the castle and they had their vans, cranes, sacks of cement and various bits of equipment strewn about in front of the building, somewhat spoiling the view. I enquired of who appeared to be the head man, who said I should speak to the owner. One of the builders then disappeared into the castle. I followed him and the owner appeared, an American gentleman.

I asked for permission to photograph but he was reluctant at first, mentioning rightly that the castle was not looking its best and did not want any images posted on social media. I gave him my solemn word that any pictures would be solely for my private use and guaranteed that they would never appear in public. (That is why I cannot provide any photographs). He graciously accepted my assurance and gave me permission.

The foreman builder was a knowledgeable man, who told me that the castle dates from the 1200s and pointed out that the battlements along the frontage were more recent. He showed me the line on the central tower of an old pitched roof, saying that a flat roof was now concealed behind the parapet. On leaving I politely declined his request for a portrait and thanked him for all his kind help.

A truly worthwhile expedition. Pity the castle was not open to the public. I mentally forgave the owner for entrusting a historic English structure to American hands. One could take the view that at least he was restoring the castle, which otherwise might have fallen into wrack and ruin.

Edenham Parish Council Meeting 11th May 2021 Clerk's Notes

This is the first face to face meeting of the Parish Council since March 2020. The meeting was attended by Parish Councillors Mrs Cranfield, Mrs Treacy, Mr Bradley, Mr Clarke, Mr Wilson, Mrs Marshall, Mr Hawes, and the Parish Clerk, Mrs Sands.

Election of Officers: Chairman - Cllr P Cranfield, Vice Chairman: - Cllr Clarke

Updates from Previous Meeting

Community street cleaning - We are continuing to see a high level of litter around the villages and increased fly tipping activity near Gunborough Hill.

Overnight parking - A resident has reported that HGV's are using the coal yard pull in area on Main Street, Edenham for overnight parking and that litter and human excrement have been found when the vehicle has left the area. This is concerning as parents taking their children to Edenham School use this area for parking. It was resolved that the Parish Clerk contact Grimsthorpe Estate who own the land to ask for support in trying to resolve this matter.

Speed Indicator monitor - Parish Clerk has collated data from the

speed monitor, this shows that there are a large number of vehicles passing through the village at excessive speed, the highest recorded was 105 mph. Concerns were raised for the safety of residents and children attending Edenham and Pillarwood Farm Pre-school. It was resolved that the Parish Clerk contact Lincolnshire Police to ask for support with this ongoing issue.

Gigabyte Voucher Scheme - Cllr Clarke confirmed that there has been no further progress. Cllr Clarke will contact LCC Cllr Hill to ask for support.

Openreach/BT exchange, Main Street, Grimsthorpe - Openreach/BT is now disputing ownership of the wall and the conifer trees. The Parish Council is continuing to look for a resolution and are reviewing the Land Registry documents.

Flower beds - The tractor tyres are in place and have been fully planted. The project has been completed without any costs. The Councillors would like to thank Mr Peter Eustance and Mr Eddy Peeling who have very kindly donated plants and Councillor Bradley for his work on delivering this project.

Grey Bin by the river bridge - Cllr Bradley confirmed that the bin has

now been removed from this location.

Waste Water issues Pillarwood Farmhouse/A151 - Cllr Hawes confirmed that Grimsthorpe Estate is now progressing this issue with Anglian Water.

Dog walking on the playing fields -The Parish Clerk has been contacted by a resident who has raised concerns about the number of people walking their dogs on the playing field especially as this is used by children's football teams. It was also highlighted that a bag of dog waste was left on one of the benches. It was agreed that Cllr Wilson review this with the Village Hall committee, as they look after the playing field.

New Benches - The Chair of Steam Action is looking to purchase two new benches for the play area and has asked if the Parish Council would be willing to add the benches to the Insurance Policy.

Great British Spring Clean - This is taking place 28th May to 13th June 2021. Councillors raised a number of health and safety concerns; it was resolved that the Parish Council would not commit to this.

Ingredients:
125g butter
150g caster sugar
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 egg (beaten)
3 bananas (mashed)
100g chocolate chips (white or milk are best)
190g self-raising flour
60ml milk
Sprinkle of demerara sugar (if liked)

1. Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin. Melt butter, sugar and vanilla in a saucepan over a medium heat.

2. Remove from heat and add the mashed bananas, mix well.

3. Add egg, mix well.

4. Stir in the flour and the milk. Once combined, add the chocolate chips.

5. Pour into the prepared tin, sprinkle with a teaspoon of demerara sugar to give crunch topping, if liked.

6. Bake at 170[°]C (150[°]C fan, gas mark 3) for 45 minutes until a skewer comes out clean. Leave to cool and enjoy.
