



## **The Vicar Writes**

Telling someone the same thing over and over again can be condescending, inefficient and, at the same time, absolutely necessary. If you hadn't guessed already, I'm talking about myself. I'm terrible. I forget things. Sometimes I forget them immediately after I've been told (especially on Sundays – Sundays are the worst!). You may not think it possible, but I do believe that I'm capable of forgetting something as I'm hearing it (literally in one ear and out the other).

Sometimes it isn't my fault!

If Lesley asks me to nip to the co-op at Elsea Park, I'll get into the car, wait for my phone to sync with the stereo, select some music, a podcast, or maybe an audiobook. I'll carefully reverse (keeping a watchful eye the image from the camera on the boot), before heading down the drive and turning down whatever I'm listening to so as not to disturb the neighbours. When I reach the traffic lights before Scottlethorpe Road I'll look to see if those potholes by the drains have been filled-in, and I'll probably wonder if anyone would mind if I reappropriated the traffic cones that've been left by the side of the road.

At this point I'll be heading along the A151 with the reason for my journey slowly fading in my mind. In all likelihood my subconscious autopilot will kick-in and I'll instinctively turn-off towards Lound and Toft as if heading for St Andrew's at Withamon-the-Hill before stopping little further down the road and trying to figure the where, why, and what of it.

If only there weren't so many things to distract me, none of this would happen!

On that basis I do find myself sympathising with the disciples after Jesus was arrested, tried, crucified, and buried. They were left scattered, disoriented, and afraid. There was no way they could've seen any of this coming. No way!

Or was there?

You could be forgiven for wondering if any of them were listening when St Matthew tells us in chapter sixteen of his Gospel that, "From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Matt 16.21).

Perhaps they had other things on their mind when, in St Mark's Gospel chapter nine, Jesus was saying to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days he will rise" (Mark 9.31-32).

Or how about when Jesus took the

twelve aside in St Luke's Gospel and told them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. For he will be delivered over to the Gentiles and will be mocked and shamefully treated and spat upon. And after flogging him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise" (Luke 18.31-34). How inconsiderate of Jesus not to tell them exactly what was going to happen again and again and again! And it wasn't only Jesus who tried to tell the disciples. In chapter twentyfour of St Luke's Gospel the angel that greeted Mary Magdalene and the other women at the empty tomb asked them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise" (Luke 24.5b-8). And what did the women do? They remembered! St Luke continues, "They remembered

his words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, but these words seemed to them an 'idle tale', and they did not believe them" (Luke 24.8-11).

WHAT?! If this were a TV drama, you'd probably be throwing the sofa cushions at the television in disgust! You could almost wonder if, when the risen Jesus suddenly appeared to them in the locked room, at least one of the disciples might have stood up and said "You know, this is all starting to sound strangely familiar..."

But perhaps we shouldn't judge the disciples too harshly. After all, Jesus calls us all to follow him on a lifelong journey of faith. No one commits to following Christ and simply gets holier and holier each year to the point where they eventually reach superdisciple status. Very often the Christian life seems like one step forward and two steps back. It's a pattern of growth and setbacks. Everyone must learn, and then be reminded, and then be reminded again.

So, if you're still wrestling with some of what you were taught back in your

Confirmation classes or with patterns of behaviour that you've been trying to remedy for years, I can assure you that you're in good company! But what I would also say to you is 'don't give up'. The road may indeed be narrow but it's also long. The key is to keep on keeping on; the key is Christ himself and the hope of his Resurrection and that's a key which, thank God, you'll never lose down the back of the sofa or ever forget where you left it.

## **Losecoat Remembered**

Some years ago, on a visit to Pickworth in Rutland, I was delighted to find that a new memorial to the Battle of Losecoat Field had been installed outside the church. The battle, which was fought nearby, has been an interest of mine for many years and I often go to the site. Apparently, the memorial was unveiled a year earlier. It must have been a low-key event as it seemed to have attracted hardly any publicity.

The battle was fought on March 12<sup>th</sup> 1470 between Great Casterton and the narrow lane from Pickworth to the A1 slip road. Often spelt Losecote, it took place during the Wars of the Roses, the armed conflict between the Royal houses of York and Lancaster to decide who sat on the throne of England. In March 1470 the Yorkist King Edward IV was the occupant. At the time his younger brother the Duke of Clarence and the Earl of Warwick were trying to raise rebellion against the Crown.

Warwick encouraged his associates, Lord Welles and his son Sir Robert, to attack Sir Thomas Burgh of Gainsborough, one of the King's followers in Lincolnshire. Lord Welles was arrested and summoned to London to account for his actions and in response his son raised an army in Lincolnshire.

The King set out from London with his own army to put down the rebellion. He brought Lord Welles with him, reaching Great Casterton on 12<sup>th</sup> March to find the rebels arrayed on a ridge before him. Before closing with the enemy, the King sent forward heralds to summon them to surrender and disperse. When they refused, Edward had Lord Welles beheaded in front of his son's army. The ensuing battle was a short-lived affair. After a furious cannonade and a cavalry charge, the rebels fled, throwing off their coats with the identifying emblems, hence the name for the battle. Sir Robert was later captured and executed after implicating Warwick and Clarence in the plot to overthrow the King. Following more failed attempts at rebellion, Warwick and Clarence were forced to flee to France.

The memorial (pictured over) takes the form of a handsome statue of a soldier removing his coat, and is placed in front of the stone wall surrounding Pickworth church. According to a leaflet obtained from the church, the statue is of Clipsham Limestone and the base from Ketton architectural stone.

A brass plaque on the base bears the legend:

"Losecote Remembered. 12 March 1470. 2015. Tony Rawlings (Sculptor)."

There is an information panel in front of the church with some interesting

history of the village including the battle, supplemented by the leaflet from the church which is usually open to visitors.

Losecoat Field is one of those few battlefields that have hardly changed in over five centuries. The A1 dual carriageway has been built over the southern part and I suspect that hedges and trees have been planted on the site. In common with too many battlefields, you would not know it was there. Only the fine statue and the information panel in front of the church offers clues.

To celebrate the millennium, Rutland County Council erected many information boards around the county



to celebrate its history and one was placed in a muddy lay-by on the narrow lane to Pickworth from the A1 slip road giving information on the battle. Sadly, the board has now long gone.

The only other memorial is at Oakham Castle. Hanging on the walls of the Great Hall are many horseshoes donated by Peers of the Realm when visiting Oakham. The earliest is from King Edward IV dated 1470 placed there to celebrate his victory at Losecoat Field.

On Ordnance Survey maps the battle is designated "Empingham 1470." But even this was dropped from the very popular 1:50,000 scale Landranger series. However, it is still there on the more specialised 1:25,000 scale Explorer series. I had a lengthy correspondence with the OS in 2007 but I am sorry to say that the designation is still missing from the Landranger maps.

This is a great shame. Unless a visitor is a map enthusiast or navigates the back roads of Rutland and finds Pickworth, he or she will miss what I think is a fascinating piece of Rutland history.



# PUBLIC-USE DEFIBRILLATORS

## **TOFT AND LOUND**

If you come across someone who is not breathing or breathing erratically:

1. The most important thing is to call 112 or 999 immediately

When you call **112** or **999**, tell the operator that you will be using the public access defibrillator and need the **code number** to open the box.

- 2. **Start CPR**—heart compressions
- 3. **Send someone** to fetch the defibrillator

<u>DO NOT delay or interrupt chest compressions to get the defibrillator, send</u> someone else to get it.

Once you have the defibrillator open it and follow the spoken instructions.

#### **VERY IMPORTANT**

The <u>defibrillator requires no training</u> - all the instructions are given by the machine. Do not wait for a 'trained' person to come and assist

## TAKE THE INITIATIVE AND FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS

#### YOU CANNOT GO WRONG!

PLEASE IGNORE the instruction on the Manthorpe and Toft boxes to give the operator the box number; they do not have numbers. Instead, simply state that you are in Manthorpe or Toft near Bourne. If you have called from a mobile on 112, the operator will already have your exact location.

## Jane's Seasonal Recipe

With rhubarb now coming into season this recipe from a Waitrose magazine is a wonderful tangy sauce to have with burgers. The magazine shows a lovely pink sauce but don't worry if it looks a caramel brown colour!

## Rhubarb ketchup

1 tablespoon sunflower oil

1 onion chopped

1 clove of garlic, roughly chopped

800g rhubarb, cut into small chunks

1 bay leaf

4 cloves

150g caster sugar

150g red wine vinegar

Fry onion in oil over a low heat with a pinch of salt, cook for 5 mins until it starts to soften. Add garlic, cook for 1 min. Add rest of ingredients. Bring to a simmer and cook for 30 mins, stirring occasionally, until rhubarb is totally soft. Remove the cloves and bay leaf. Whizz in a blender until smooth, season and mix well, Strain through a fine sieve, then transfer to sterilised jars or bottles. Store in fridge, use within 4 weeks.
