The Vicar Writes

Of shopping bags and scapegoats

If there's something that I truly loathe its food shopping. Whilst most people took-up online grocery shopping during the various lockdowns, we fell out of the habit. We used to shop online, but when getting a delivery slot became difficult (and others were far more deserving of them than we were), we decided to throw the towel in and send me instead.

The long, tall, and short of it is that I'm just no good at shopping. Ask me to get something particular and I'll forget. Give me a list of what you want and none of it will be in stock. Whatever I'm supposed to be getting I'll most likely come back with a trolley-full of yellow-label items that'll be out of date tomorrow and would certainly make uneasy bedfellows if they were ever seen side-by-side on the same plate.

But that's not all.

Having crammed everything into four bags-for-life, I'm also the sort of person who won't want to make repeated trips to unload the boot. So, having arrived home, I'll do my

darndest to carry all the bags at once from car to doorstep. Even if the heaviest bag is hanging off the tip of my little finger, I'll take the pain to avoid having to go back to the car. It's all-or-nothing as far as I'm concerned!

Now, to change the subject for a moment (we'll come back around to bags and burdens in a moment) the book of Leviticus is well-nigh crammed with all kinds of rituals and ceremonies, many of which involve goats. Of all the goat-ish rituals, by far the most interesting is the one prescribed for the Day of Atonement. On that day Aaron the Priest was instructed to do the following, "Aaron shall lay both his hands on the head of a live goat and confess over it all the iniquities of the people of Israel, and all their transgressions, all their sins. And he shall put them on the head of the goat and send it away into the wilderness by the hand of a man who is in readiness. The goat shall bear all their iniquities on itself to a remote area, and he shall let the goat go free in the wilderness." (Leviticus 16.21-22)

Just imagine a goat that knew everything that everyone had ever



done wrong. It's as if all the badness, all the hate, all the disobedience had been poured-out over this poor, unlucky creature. If I were that goat, I would want to get as far away from that group of people as quickly as possible. How about being banished to a remote area out in the wilderness? Sounds great!

There is, of course, a direct parallel between the Day of Atonement and the life and death of Jesus (something that we consider on Good Friday). What we should be aware of though is that, according to the principle established here, the people of God were taught from the beginning that there are some things, some burdens, that they were simply NOT MEANT TO CARRY.

We often wear ourselves out (or do damage to our bodies) when we try to carry more than we should – more than we can bear. We look at bags and burdens and surmise "It's not that heavy. It's just awkward." It could be something physical or it could be something emotional or spiritual. We decide to take it on, come what may, and we end up counting the cost.

But that's not what God wants.

God, it seems, will always provide a means or mechanism to relieve us of the things that we're not meant to bear (and the good news is that you don't need a goat to access them). Just look at what he says in the Bible, "Cast your burden on the Lord, and he will sustain you" (Psalm 55.22a), "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4.6), "Cast all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you" (1 Peter 5.7), "Jesus said: Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt 11.28).

Anxiety, fear, shame, and regret are all things that we're not meant to bear or to carry alone. Attempting to do so will only leave us heavy laden. Jesus is there to help us bear the burden. All we have to do is to swallow our pride, admit our fault and take him up on his offer. You only need to ask and have confidence in his ability to help, heal, and restore. Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council - Toft cum Lound & Manthorpe

Eight people plus parish councillors attended the AGM on 5th May at the St Andrews Parish Hall, Witham on the Hill.

Cllr Richard Stephenson was elected chairman with Cllr Jeremy Dawson Vice-Chairman. Councillors approved the Certificate of Exemption which confirmed that the authorities total gross income and expenditure for the year ending 31st March did not exceed £25,000. They also approved the Annual Governance Statement and Accounting Statements for the same year. The Clerk explained that income was larger than previous year due to a grant towards gym equipment for the playing field plus a donation from Toft Golf Club towards the movement of the defibrillator from Toft House Hotel. Expenditure was also greater during 2021/22 due to a large amount of money spent on work at Jasmine Cottage, purchase of a leisure bench and new gate for the playing field, three oak trees, salt box and donation to NHS Charities together. Information to be placed on the parish website.

The council continues to give donations annually to The Royal British Legion, St Andrews PCC, LIVES, Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance, Edenham School, Willoughby School and St. Barnabas Hospice.

Concern was again raised about a pink food trailer parked in front of the defibrillator at the golf course, and tiles missing from the Bus Shelter, both at Toft.

Cllr Stephenson reported on arrangements for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. He also reported that the council had again been successful in obtaining a second grant from the National Lottery towards new play equipment. Cllr Stephenson was thanked for all his hard work.

Next Parish Council meeting to take place at Witham on the Hill in September, date to be confirmed.

Planning Appeals Notification

The Parish Council was notified of an Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate by Cornerstone and Telefonica UK Limited for the installation of a 20m monopole and supporting equipment on the grass verge on Main Street (A151), between Grimsthorpe and Edenham.

The Parish Council have sent representations to the Planning Inspectorate due to the proposed location which is only a few feet away from the curtilage of Grimsthorpe Castle, a Grade I listed building, at the end of the drive to a Grade II* listed building, the Gardener's Cottage, and adjacent to the boundary of a garden and parkland listed in Historic England's Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest. The monopole would be in an open area, beside a main road and it be visually intrusive from these important listed properties. Concerns were also raised about the lack of

PUBLIC-USE DEFIBRILLATORS

TOFT AND LOUND

If you come across someone who is not breathing or breathing erratically:

1. The most important thing is to call 112 or 999 immediately

When you call **112** or **999**, tell the operator that you will be using the public access defibrillator and need the **code number** to open the box.

2. Start CPR—heart compressions

3. Send someone to fetch the defibrillator

DO NOT delay or interrupt chest compressions to get the defibrillator, **send** someone else to get it.

Once you have the defibrillator open it and follow the spoken instructions.

VERY IMPORTANT

The <u>defibrillator requires no training</u> - all the instructions are given by the machine. Do not wait for a 'trained' person to come and assist

TAKE THE INITIATIVE AND FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS

YOU CANNOT GO WRONG!

PLEASE IGNORE the instruction on the Manthorpe and Toft boxes to give the operator the box number; they do not have numbers. Instead, simply state that you are in Manthorpe or Toft near Bourne. If you have called from a mobile on 112, the operator will already have your exact location.

Jane's Seasonal Recipe

We grow spring cauliflowers every year, but they always all come at once, so we have a lot of cauliflower cheese and cauli soup! I came across this recipe and it is a good way of getting your family to eat cauli without them knowing it!

Pork and cauliflower meatballs

200g pork mince 200g cauliflower (1/2 a small one, whizzed in the food processor or grated) 25g fresh basil chopped 1 red chilli chopped (optional) Zest of 1 lemon 1 beaten egg 1 tablespoon tomato puree Seasoning 2 tablespoons olive oil 6 spring onions sliced 1 400g tin chopped tomatoes 160g baby spinach spaghetti

Mix mince, cauli, basil, chilli, lemon zest, tomato puree and season. Bind with egg. Shape into 8 meatballs and chill for 2 hours to firm up. Fry spring onions in olive oil over medium heat until just soft, add tomatoes, simmer for 15 mins. In a frying pan brown meatballs in oil, then add to simmering sauce until cooked through. Cook spaghetti in boiling water, and add spinach for 1 min. Drain and serve with meatballs.
