The Vicar Writes

I discovered a new phrase over the Jubilee weekend. I was listening to 'Today' on Radio Four and caught part of an interview with David Dimbleby where he used the words "extraordinary inscrutability". I was intrigued! So, I spooled back twenty seconds or so on my phone to listen more closely. Speaking about the Jubilee, Dimbleby was asked, "What would you say about the Queen and the way she has gone about her duties in these seventy years?" He responded, "It's very much about one characteristic that I would cite which is an extraordinary inscrutability. It's very difficult in the modern age being a monarch, particularly with a large family and with a very over-excited press (always wanting to work out what's happening). Anybody who diverts from the role of monarch and reveals too much of themselves gets seized on. The Queen is hugely admired now, simply for never having been anything other than inscrutable. Obviously, we see her smiling and enjoying things; we know she likes going to the races and her corgis (she derives pleasure in such things). But

day after day after day of her life, the burden of having to talk with people she doesn't know, show interest in everything from scientific progress to a hospital to a school (and then there's a regiment to see and a dinner to speak at), the list goes on and on... It's the remorselessness of being head of state; everyone looking at you and all the while never indulging in any hint of what you're actually thinking. I think that's what people have admired about her."

In some ways that seemed a rather odd thing to say. How can we admire someone for not saying what they're really thinking? It almost sounds dishonest. But what we see in the example of the Queen isn't something that is fake, dishonest, or unreal (she's not merely playing a part). Rather, she puts the role, the duty, and the needs of others before her own needs, wants and desires. She is the Queen for us (for you and me). She is monarch for the sake of others, for her people, this nation, and the Commonwealth at large. She puts duty and service before all else and has done so now for more than 70 years. Ultimately, 'extraordinary inscrutability' means self-sacrifice. It

means putting others first. That has been her example to us and that, I believe, will be her legacy.

What's more, the Queen has stated on numerous occasions that it is never by her own strength alone that she has sought to fulfil this tremendous duty. Right from the off she has sought the help and strength of Almighty God and she has repeatedly asked the prayers of those whom she serves so that might be strengthened and sustained in this endeavour. At the time of her Coronation in 1953 she said: "When I spoke to you last... I asked you all, to pray for me on the day of my Coronation – to pray that God would give me wisdom and strength to carry out the promises that I should then be making... I have been uplifted and sustained by the knowledge that your thoughts and prayers were with me."

We may wonder, now that the Jubilee weekend has passed, how we might continue to show our love, our gratitude, and support for the Queen? Well, if we were to enquire of the Sovereign herself, to say to her "Ma'am, what could I do for you?" Perhaps she would ask us to do no more than to continue to pray for her and to ask God to give her the wisdom and strength to fulfil the promises she made those many years ago. For we know, without giving her true feelings away, that our prayers and support are of real comfort and value to her personally. So, let us do just that. Let us ask God to help make good her vow as we continue to offer our prayers of thanksgiving for our inscrutable Queen.



Jane's Seasonal Recipe

Tasty cookies from a recipe in a Prima magazine home-made Christmas gifts booklet. Not exclusively for Christmas!

Eggnog Cookies

125g soft butter
125g caster sugar
2 tbsp milk
2 tsp vanilla extract
150g sr flour
25g custard powder
½ tsp cinnamon
½ tsp nutmeg
3 tbsp bronze crunch pieces (Waitrose Cooks' ingredients)

Line 2 large baking sheets with parchment. Beat butter, sugar and milk until pale and creamy. Add flour, custard powder and spices, beat until combined. Divide dough into 12 pieces, shape into balls. Roll in bronze crunch. Place on baking trays, spaced well apart to allow for spreading, press down lightly with palm of hand to flatten slightly. Bake 150°C for 30 mins until edges are just firming, but centres still soft. Cool for 5 mins on tray, then transfer to a wire rack to cool and crisp up.
